Everything you need to know to create an excellent video presentation for the Online SJP Symposium.

WHAT IS THE SJP SYMPOSIUM?

The SJP Symposium is the final requirement for the SJP Practicum. The Symposium is an academic conference style presentation where students detail their practicum experience. The Symposium is an online presentation (both Chicago and Vancouver students will present in-person).

In this presentation, you will outline, amongst other things, the internship site, the completed deliverable, and how the practicum has helped them to become better social justice practitioners.

You will be submitting a video recording of yourself in Canvas discussing your practicum experience. You may choose to use visuals (i.e. PowerPoint) to support your online symposium, but this is optional.

Please note: For students that did not complete their practicum at a physical location, your symposium presentation should still follow the same guidelines as they still apply.

THINGS TO KNOW BEFORE YOU GET STARTED!



Ensure You Submit On-Time!

- Unless there are extenuating circumstances, late submissions will not receive a grade.
- Extensions are granted solely at the discretion of the profession.



Technology

- Video Software: Use of Panopto is encouraged, however you can use other any video software that you have available.
 - If you choose to use other software, please ensure you can upload and/or provide a “Public” link to your video in Canvas.
- You may choose to use a visual in your video, you can use a wide variety of methods to create this including: PowerPoint, Infographics, Pictures, etc.



Tips for Success

- Reach out for help before Week 6
- Practice before recording and try writing out a script to help you.
- Test out your recording device to ensure your device works properly (i.e. the microphone works)
- Don't overcrowd your slides with text
- Use images that are appropriate and relevant to your work.
- Identify relevant course content that helps explain your practicum.

PRESENTATION REQUIREMENTS



In your introduction mention: First & Last Name, Program, and campus



Length = 8-12 Minutes



Audio is required



Use references where applicable and cite them appropriately



Video link is shared as “Public” (this ensures anyone can access it)

The Deliverable

SJP SITE OVERVIEW

Orient your audience to the organization/institute/agency/special project where you completed your deliverable by addressing the following:

- Mission and Vision
- A brief history of the social problem(s) that the organization is working to ameliorate
- Provide specific information about the population(s) and geographic area(s) affected/served
- Describe the resources and/or services that the organization provides
- Identify which programs are operating
- Describe how the organization engages the community

PROJECT(S) & TASKS

Specifically state what you did in your internship by addressing the following:

- Describe the work you did for your practicum
- How did your weekly tasks help to eliminate or address systemic barrier(s) your practicum/organization took a stance against?
- List the observable impacts from your efforts (e.g. greater assistance leads to helping more people)
- How were project efforts evaluated?
- Explain how your efforts assisted in the actualization of the organizational mission.

HOW WERE YOU CHANGED BY YOUR SJP?

Please address the following where applicable:

- How has your practicum informed or revealed aspects of your socialization?
- What do you now understand about:
 - The social and systemic contexts that people live in
 - The specific civic action that needs to occur in order to improve their quality of life and advance social equity?
- Share the privileges and/or disadvantages you are aware of and how you will integrate your new knowledge, skills, and attitudes into your professional work as a socially responsible practitioner.

GROWING YOUR SKILLSET & TOOLBOX

- ❑ What sharpened skills have you acquired through your SJP experience that will help you to address systemic barriers and structural inequities?

Note: You should specifically name and discuss these systemic barriers and structural inequities. Below are some examples of skills you might employ in your work as a socially responsible practitioner to work alongside community to create social change:

- Advocacy
- Resource Development
- Research
- Partnership development/Linkage Agreements
- Popular Education
- Community Organizing/Outreach
- Networking (Joined: coalitions, initiatives, etc.; Acquired: new contracts, subscriptions, etc.)

THE DELIVERABLE

Please address the following where applicable:

- Describe what you did for your deliverable
 - *Note: You can show images of this or provide links to what you did.*
- What is the goal or aim of the deliverable completed?
- Explain how your deliverable aids in the community or addresses an injustice
- Provide evidence that proves your deliverable will be useful to the community
- Share the insights you have gained from developing your deliverable.

TIPS FOR RECORDING YOUR PRESENTATION

- You will be recording yourself presenting your practicum experience, please create a recording that shows your face.
- Try writing a script. A script will help you plan out what to say during your recording and stay on track to touch on the required components.
- Be mindful of where you are recording:
 - Ensure your space is well lit
 - Make sure to minimize background noise
 - Dress appropriately
- After recording, watch the whole thing back to ensure the audio is clear and easy to understand.
- Turn on Closed Captions! This ensures your video is accessible to a wide variety of people. If you choose to use Panopto, it can generate automatic closed captions.
